Birding the Andes in Peru

By Richard Gibbons

Richard is the Conservation Director for Houston Audubon where he manages their sanctuaries, develops and manages monitoring programs, and advocates for bird conservation in the region.



He has worked as an ornithologist throughout the Americas for 18 years including bird banding, hawk watching, and colonial water bird management. He recently earned his PhD working at LSU's Museum of Natural Science where he split his time between coordinating citizen science projects and studying birds, wetlands, and climate change in Peru's high Andes. The trip was five three-month expeditions to the puna ecosystem, the tundra like region above the tree line and below snowline. Working with Peruvian scientists, we studied the unique wetlands, the birds, and the potential effects of climate change on this poorly understood ecosystem.

Brazoria National Wildlife Refuge Field Trip

Saturday, November 14, 8:30 AM

Led by Jean Booth

Meet at 8:30 at the refuge visitor center. Will start with the Big Slough Boardwalk & Trail then head out on the auto tour. If you have walkie talkies please bring them.

Lunch after the auto tour then as time permits we can explore other hotspots in the vicinity.

Big Slough Boardwalk & Trail (0.6 miles)

The boardwalk over the slough provides a close encounter with a lovely marsh crowned with spiky cattail and bulrush which offer renowned wildlife viewing and photography. The trail winds through low forests of yaupon and small clearings to an observation platform.

Big Slough Auto Tour (7.5 miles)

The auto tour runs through the Big Slough Recreation Area, the heart of the Brazoria NWR. Visit a salt marsh observation deck. Teal and Rogers Pond observation platforms offer panoramic

views of waterfowl congregations, wading and shore birds. A self-guided audio tour CD and brochure is available at the information pavilion. Bicycling is permitted on the gravel road.

Middle Bayou Trail (2 miles)

Refuge visitors can hike or bike an elevated trail that follows an abandoned railway line. The trail starts at the Bastrop Bayou Fishing Area with visitors enjoying views across the rare bluestem coastal prairie.

Directions

From the intersection of SH 288 and FM 523 in Angleton, take FM 523 to SH 2004 intersection, continue on FM 523 for 5.5 miles to CR227, turn left, go 1.7 miles to Brazoria NWR gate at your right. The Brazoria NWR is located 10 miles east of Lake Jackson.

October Anahuac NWR Field Trip

We started at the Visitors Center and parked the cars and immediately sited a Vermillion Flycatcher. We then walked around the pond near the Center to give time for everyone to arrive.

Then we started our auto tour of Shoveler Pond. Some highlights were a White-tailed Kite, female Indigo Bunting, and Marsh Wren. After a short break we headed to Frozen Point Road where we were entertained by an American Bittern standing about one foot from the side of the road, head up and neck extended. It sat in a squatted position for a while and then decided to do

"the crawl" slowly across the road right in front of our cars and what a site it was. We also had close looks at Northern Harrier in the fields.



We then went back to the Visitors Center for lunch, met another birder who had seen a Barred Owl at Skillern Tract so we headed out. We parked on the grass lot at the entrance to Skillern Tract and walked along the wooded area west of the road and followed the East Bay Bayou all the way to the main parking lot. Highlights included Crested Caracara, Fulvous Whistling Ducks and Anhinga, American Avocet, Belted Kingfisher and Wilson's Snipe along with other species.

Our species count totaled 62 for the day. Fun was had by all! \frac{\top\}{}
