Texas State Parks Status

Almost all Texas State Parks are open, although access and hours may be limited, and camping still closed at some. The following are closed until further notice: Mustang Island SP (Corpus Christi), Honey Creek SNA (Spring Branch), Balmorhea SP (Toyahvale), Hueco Tanks SP & Wyler Aerial Tramway (El Paso).

Texas' National Parks status

On July 1, the National Park Service announced the temporary closure of Big Bend National Park and Rio Grande Wild & Scenic River, beginning July 2, "in response to a positive case for COVID-19 in the park residential community." It has not reopened, as of Aug 3.

Several trails have reopened, for day-use only, in Guadalupe Mountains National Park: Devil's Hall trail (to Pine Spring Canyon), Guadalupe Peak trail, and the Frijole Ranch area including the Smith Springs loop trail. This is a positive step and we hope to see both of the campgrounds, back-country access, and the visitor center re-open as well.

Aracari in Spring Branch

Unique opportunity to see and hear a beautiful male **Curl-crested Aracari**, *Pteroglossus beauharnaesii*, at <u>Adventures in Birds</u>, 7414 Westview Dr., just west of Antoine, in Spring Branch.

This heavy-billed, small toucan is found south of the Equator in humid tropical forest in Peru, Brazil, and Bolivia. The crown and nape are dark gray, nearly black, covered with shiny curled feathers, the dark eyes surrounded by turquoise, and the face and neck white, flecked with black. The large bill is tipped with bright orange; the lower mandible is cream-colored, and the upper mandible iridescent purple-maroon. There are two bright red patches, on the upper back and on the rump, and a single red belly band. The underside is yellow, and the back, wings, tail, and leg feathers are dark gray-green.
