Each month, the Zoom lobby opens at 6:45pm for check-in, and the meetings begin at 7:00. Zoom links are sent to registered OG/ ONC members.



OG is kicking off 2022 again with membership-drive <u>field trip to the Laas Farm in Waller County</u> on <u>Jan 8 at 7:30AM</u>. The field trip will be led by John Berner and Harvey Laas. Space is limited, please RSVP by December 31, 2021 (email Lisa scissortailed20@yahoo.com).

#### A summary from our January 2021 field trip to Laas Farm:

The day started as slow and worrisome with fog and drizzle, but we had luck on our side after 8AM. It stayed cloudy but dry the entire morning to allow us 5+ hrs of fine birding. Led by John Berner and Harvey Laas, we walked/drove to corners of the farm, and spotted/heard 73 species of birds. All birds are good, with some more special than others. We were treated with a pair of nesting Great Horned Owls AND a pair of Barred Owls. Not to be outshined by owls, sparrows (LeConte's and Lark Buntings, along with other species) not only showed up, they also perched long enough for good viewing and pictures. One shy Eastern Towhee played hide-n-seek with us, but eventually lured out by John that everyone enjoyed a brief view. We also flushed out a pair of Common Ground Doves, which landed on a bush just long enough for us to get our binocs on them. Around Pine Lake, we connected with purple finches and flycatchers (Ash-throated and Couch's). The lake was also home for hundreds waterfowls and herons, including 9 Black-crowned Night Herons.

# Results & Trends of the 121st Christmas Bird Count (Dec 2020-Jan 2021)

Last year's CBC was an interesting one. While the COVID-19 pandemic definitely put a damper on the more social aspects of the counts, and a few count circles in high-transmission areas decided to cancel for the year, more than 2,000 counts still took place. Director of the CBC, Geoff LeBaron noticed some really interesting trends in the data, and he and the rest of Audubon's Science team have spent some time digging into the numbers. #### **December Trivia Q:**

What two bird species are the sole members of their Orders and Families?

**Hoatzin,** *Opisthocomus hoazin*, is pheasant-sized, originally described in 1776 by German zoologist Statius Müller, found in South America-Amazonia, and is the national bird of Guyana.

It is in the Order Opisthocomiformes.

"The Hoatzin is one of the most ancient, living bird lineages, possibly sister to the Caprimulgiformes (sensu lato (Kuhl et al. 2020)"

The **Cuckoo Roller** or **Courol**, *Leptosomus discolor* (Hermann 1783), from Madagascar and the Comoro Islands, also has its own Order: Leptosomiformes.

"Formerly included in the Coraciiformes, the Cuckoo Roller is the only member of an ancient lineage that is the sister group to Trogoniformes, Bucerotiformes, Coraciiformes and Piciformes (Hackett et al. 2008, Prum et al. 2015)."

"Unlike the true rollers and ground rollers, where the sexes have identical appearance, the cuckoo roller is sexually dichromatic." Males have a pale ivory underside.
